# Safeguarding

When we talk about 'safeguarding' we mean the measures that are put in place, and the actions that are taken, to support the welfare of children, young people and adults, and protect them from harm.

#### **BE Safeguarding Strategy**

Badminton should always be a safe and welcoming sport for all. BE's new Safeguarding Strategy sets out four key areas that are imperative for ensuring the physical and emotional safety of players and participants, adults and juniors, across the country. - An Annual Safeguarding Report that shows the progress and impact of the Safeguarding Strategy.
- An increase in the reporting of low-level concerns, behaviour which is not consistent with the standards and values of our sport.
- An increase in contact and oversight of affiliated clubs, supporting them to maintain required safeguarding standards and continually strive to implement best practice.
- Trained Welfare Officers in every County.
- A community of badminton players, parents and volunteers who feel better equipped to identify and share any concerns, with the knowledge that there is a robust support network in place to help.
- An England Performance Pathway that leads by example, sets the standard and shares best practice with others to help sport become safer for all.
